Government of Canada supports Three Sisters Cultural Centre through the Tourism Relief Fund

<u>Three Sisters Cultural Centre has</u> received a non-repayable contribution of \$400,000 from the Government of Canada's Tourism Relief Fund, through the <u>Federal Economic Development Agency for Southern Ontario</u> (FedDev Ontario) to assist in experiential program development.

The Three Sisters Cultural Centre is Waterloo Region's new cultural centre, providing an avenue for local artists to make and sell their work in the tourism destination of St. Jacobs. Through affordable studio spaces to rent, opportunities to host workshops and participation in exhibitions, the creative industry is in a supportive environment where art blossoms and culture thrives.

Established during the pandemic, Three Sisters has created ways the public can easily access and particiate in the arts. Through sales and workshops, artists have the opportunity to sell their products and in turn these activities attract visitors to St. Jacobs. As tourists return and residents venture out more, Three Sisters is becoming a community hub, a place for people to meet, learn and engage with art together.

This <u>Tourism Relief Fund (TRF)</u> investment will help Three Sisters Cultural Centre adapt and mature to attract new visitors and help drive economic growth in Waterloo Region.

- The tourism industry accounts for \$39.4 billion of Ontario's gross domestic product (GDP) and supports more than 820,000 jobs.
